Tips for Answering Free Response Questions on the AP Exam

- 1. Do not simplify arithmetic in your answers. If you do so incorrectly, you can miss the point.
- 2. Do not cross out work until you have replaced it with a better solution. Crossed out work will not be read.
- 3. Label your answers and use correct units.
- 4. Always finish the problem, even if you think the first part may be incorrect.
- 5. Show your work in mathematical terms, not calculator syntax.
- 6. Do not write incorrect math (i.e. -15.34 = 15.34)
- 7. Write your answers correct to three decimal places, either rounded or truncated.
- 8. Clearly refer to the problem say things like "the Riemann Sum from part (a)" rather than just "a Riemann Sum".
- 9. Always, always include the constant of integration (+C) in an indefinite integral and the limits of integration along with the integrand in a definite integral.
- 10. Do not use your calculator other than for graphing or finding roots, points of intersection, numerical derivatives and numerical integration.
- 11. Justify your answer when required!
